

SUGGESTED VISITATION SCHEDULE JUVENILE DIVISION

A non-custodial parent, absent unusual circumstances found to exist by the Court, shall be entitled to liberal visitation privileges with a child, or children, of the parties as follows:

Weekend Visitation: Alternating weekends, commencing at dismissal from school/daycare on Friday and continuing until the following Sunday evening at 6:00 p.m., except that all special holiday, midweek, and summer visitation as hereinafter set forth shall take precedence. Weekend visitations missed due to conflicts with special holiday, midweek, or summer visitations will not be made up. The non-custodial parent is responsible for pickup at school/daycare at the beginning of each weekend visitation.

Midweek Visitation: During the children's school year, Wednesday evening on the 2nd and 4th Wednesday of each month, commencing at 6:00 p.m. and ending at 8:00 p.m. The non-custodial parent is responsible for pickup and return of the child(ren) at the beginning and end of each midweek visitation.

Summer Vacation: Two separate 15-day periods as defined by the summer school break. Unless otherwise agreed upon by the parties, the summer visitation shall commence July 1st at 9:00 a.m. and end July 15th at 6:00 p.m. and begin again on August 1st and end August 15th at the times stated above. The custodial parent shall have 15 days for extended summer vacation each year, commencing on June 15th and running for 15 consecutive days. During that two-week summer visitation period, the non-custodial parent's normal visitation will be suspended.

Child Support: During the separate 15-day periods, child support shall abate by on-half for the four-week period stated above.

HOLIDAY VISITATION

Spring Break: Even-numbered years as defined by the school system, commencing at 6:00 p.m. the day school dismisses for Spring Break and continuing until 6:00 p.m. the day before school resumes.

Easter Weekend: Odd-numbered years, commencing at 6:00 p.m. Friday until 6:00 p.m. on Easter Sunday.

Memorial Day: Even-numbered years, commencing at 6:00 p.m. on Friday until 6:00 p.m. on Monday.

Independence Day: Odd-numbered years, commencing at 9:00 a.m. until 9:00 p.m.

Labor Day: Even-numbered years, commencing at 6:00 p.m. on Friday until 6:00 p.m. on Monday.

Halloween: Odd-numbered years, commencing at 5:00 p.m. until 9:00 p.m.

Thanksgiving: Even-numbered years, commencing at 6:00 p.m. Wednesday before Thanksgiving and continuing until 6:00 p.m. Sunday.

Christmas (even-numbered years): Commencing at 10:00 a.m. on the day marking the halfway point of the school vacation and continuing until 6:00 p.m. the day before school resumes. If the parents live within a one-hour drive, the parent without the child(ren) on Christmas Day shall have visitation from 2:00 p.m. until 6:00 p.m. and shall provide transportation.

Christmas (odd-numbered years): Commencing at 6:00 p.m. on the day school dismisses for the Christmas break and continuing until 10:00 a.m. on the day marking the halfway point of the school vacation. If the parents live within a one-hour drive, the parent without the child(ren) on Christmas Day shall have visitation from 2:00 p.m. until 6:00 p.m. and shall provide transportation.

Father's Day/Mother's Day: Father shall have visitation on each Father's Day weekend and Mother shall have the same visitation each Mother's Day weekend, commencing at 6:00 p.m. on Friday until 8:00 p.m. on Sunday.

Telephone visitation: The non-custodial parent may visit with the child(ren) by telephone (at his/her own expense if long distance charges are incurred) at reasonable times prior to 8:00 p.m.

Birthdays: The party not having actual custody or visitation with the child shall enjoy three (3) hours for the purpose of party and delivery of gifts, commencing at 4:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m. on the day following each child's birthday. This visitation shall include all minor children.

The parties are encouraged to agree upon any additional visitation they may deem appropriate.

Each parent is enjoined and restrained from removing the child(ren) from the jurisdiction of this Court, except for brief vacation trips, without permission specifically granted by order of this Court, or by written consent of both parents to be filed with the Court Clerk.

Each parent shall keep the other fully informed of his/her residence address, postal box address, telephone number, and all known pertinent information regarding the health, education and welfare of the child(ren).

Neither party shall co-habitat with a member of the opposite set to whom they are not married while in the presence of the child(ren).

All communication concerning visitation and other child-related matters shall be by the parents. Children and step parents shall not be used as messengers with relation to such matters.

Neither parent shall make derogatory remarks about the other in the presence of the child(ren).

In the event the non-custodial parent is unable to exercise visitations at the prescribed time, he or she shall, as quickly as practicable, advise the custodial parent of the length of any delay or of cancellation.

Child(ren) shall not be permitted to make decisions regarding visitations. The custodial parent is charged with the duty and responsibility to insure compliance with the visitation schedule and may not independently suspend or terminate visitation for any reason, absent and emergency.

Willful violation of the Visitation Order may result in a finding of contempt of court and the violator subjected to such punishment as deemed appropriate by the Court.

SUGGESTED VISITATION FOR CHILDREN UNDER AGE 4

A non-custodial parent, absent unusual circumstances found to exist by the Court, shall be entitled visitation privileges with a child, or children, of the parties as follows:

Until age 3:

Every Saturday 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Every Wednesday evening _____.

Alternate holidays: on the day of the holiday from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Mother's Day - Child to be with Mother from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Father's Day- Child to be with Father from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Halloween- Odd Numbered Years

Thanksgiving - Even Numbered Years

Christmas Eve - Even Numbered Years

Christmas Day - Odd Numbered Years

Every Friday at 5:00 p.m., overnight, return to custodian parent 5:00 p.m.

Alternate holidays: From 5:00 p.m. the day before the holiday until 5:00 p.m. on the day of the holiday.

Standard visitation schedule

All Ages:

Proper car seat
No smoking when children present
No use of illegal drugs
No use of alcohol when children present
Reasonable telephone visitation

Each parent is enjoined and restrained from removing the child(ren) from the jurisdiction of this Court, except for brief vacation trips, without permission specifically granted by order of this Court, or by written consent of both parents to be filed with the Court Clerk.

Each parent shall keep the other fully informed of his/her residence address, postal box address, telephone number, and all known pertinent information regarding the health, education and welfare of the child(ren).

Neither party shall co-habitat with a member of the opposite set to whom they are not married while in the presence of the child(ren).

All communication concerning visitation and other child-related matters shall be by the parents. Children and step parents shall not be used as messengers with relation to such matters.

Neither parent shall make derogatory remarks about the other in the presence of the child(ren).

In the event the non-custodial parent is unable to exercise visitations at the prescribed time, he or she shall, as quickly as practicable, advise the custodial parent of the

length of any delay or of cancellation.

Child(ren) shall not be permitted to make decisions regarding visitations. The custodial parent is charged with the duty and responsibility to insure compliance with the visitation schedule and may not independently suspend or terminate visitation for any reason, absent and emergency.

Willful violation of the Visitation Order may result in a finding of contempt of court and the violator subjected to such punishment as deemed appropriate by the Court.
